VISION STATEMENT

We, the teaching staff of St. Oliver's National School, work to create a happy, inclusive learning environment where children feel safe and secure. - (c) To listen attentively and with understanding, to communicate confidently, to read fluently and accurately texts suitable to his/her ability, to write legibly and effectively for various purposes and occasions, to follow instructions and have an understanding and appreciation of language(s) other than English.
- (d) To apply the 4 arithmetical rules with understanding, speed and accuracy, to estimate and measure accurately and to use those skills in everyday situations.
- (e) To be aware of the environment the child lives in, to show consideration and respect for animal and inanimate life, to appreciate the historical and social aspects of the locality and community, to have a love and pride in his/her culture while respecting the views of others, to develop an environmental friendly attitude.
- (f) To co-ordinate fluent bodily movements, to develop finer manual skills and use them effectively and creatively, to derive pleasure and enjoyment through the various skills.
- (g) To give the child experience in the use of a variety of materials and skills so as to develop an appreciation of music and the Arts.
